NEW YORK, N. Y., Oct. 5 —The marriage of Miss Mary Lee Ryan, daughter of John J. Ryan Jr. of New York, to William Amherst Vanderbilt Cecil of Biltmore House, Asheville, N. C., and New York, took place here today in the Church of Saint Vincent Ferrer, with Father Shannon officiating.

The bride was given in marriage by her father.

The bridegroom is the son of the late Hon. John Francis Amherst Cecil of Asheville and of Mrs. V. Bulkeley-Johnson of London, England.

The bride was attended by Mrs. Anthony G. Zutter Jr. of Evanston, Ill., her sister, as matron of honor, and other attendants were Mrs. George H. V. Cecil of Biltmore, Mrs. John J. Ryan III, sister-in-law of the bride and Miss Venetia Lane of New York, Mrs. Howard Colm of Towson, Md., Miss Miss Mary L. Delafield and Mrs. Thomas H. Lineaweaver III of New York and Mrs. Arthur F. Murray of Pittsburgh Pa. They wore ballerina-length dresses of beige taffeta with coronets of fall flowers, and carried bouquets of the same flowers.
