FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT'S SON MAY REPAIR FAMILY BREAK.

Boy Sails for Italy Today at Request of Father, Who Eloped with Mrs. Edward Cheney.

Reconciliation between Frank Lloyd Wright, the Oak Park architect, and his wife, whom he deserted several months ago to elope to Europe with Mrs. Edwin Cheney, is expected, following a meeting between Wright and his son, Lloyd, in Florence, Italy. Lloyd Wright, 18 years old, is booked to sail from New York for Florence today in response to messages from his father to friends in Oak Park.

Mrs. Wright said she had received no word from her husband. From an intimate friend of the family it was learned that Wright had written asking that his son be persuaded to meet him at Florence.

The matter was discussed at length in conferences where Mrs. Wright, Lloyd, and the friend in whom the architect had confided were present. It was determined the boy should accede to his father's wishes, and preparations for the long trip were made.

There was an affectionate parting in Oak Park when the son said farewell, starting as an emissary from his mother to his father and bearing in his breast hope that he might be the means of effecting a reconciliation.

Possible return of Wright gave rise to the report that Mrs. Cheney would come back with him. Redecoration of the Cheney residence in Oak Park is regarded as preparation for Mrs. Cheney's return. At the Cheney residence it was denied that any word had been received from Mrs. Cheney.

Wright and Mrs. Cheney left Oak Park about the same time last fall. She was supposed to have gone to Denver and he to Berlin to oversee the publication of an architectural work. Later it was discovered they were traveling together through Germany.
