

Clark-Hallock Marriage Solemnized in Rome, Ga.

THE marriage of Mrs. Clare Yancey Hallock and Mr. Austin W. Clark took place Wednesday afternoon at 5 o'clock at "Clairmont," the residence of the bride's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Hamilton Yancey, in Rome, Dr. Wallace Rogers officiating.

Palms, ferns and exquisite chrysanthemums arranged in baskets and vases decorated the home. The ceremony took place in the drawing room, where an improvised altar of palms, flanked by pedestal baskets holding white chrysanthemums, alternated with cathedral candlesticks holding white tapers.

The bride was given in marriage by her father, Mr. Yancey, and wore a gown of gray chiffon velour, the waist fashioned long with flowing sleeves, the skirt draped and caught with a buckle. She wore a small hat to match, self-trimmed, and carried a shower bouquet of orchids and valley lilies.

Mrs. W. B. Clark, mother of the groom, was gowned in black satin trimmed with silver lace. Her corsage was of orchids and valley lilies.
