

M. C. Kunin dies; began salon chain

Maxim C. Kunin, 75, chairman of the board of Maxim's Beauty Salons, died yesterday.

Kunin was born in Russia, and came to Minneapolis in 1917. He opened his first beauty salon in 1920 where the Medical Arts Building now stands.

The business expanded and became one of the largest beauty chains in the country.

Kunin was a pioneer member of the National Association of Cosmetologists and a member of the Oak Ridge Country Club, Temple Israel, Mt. Sinai Hospital, the Jewish Community Center, B'nai B'rith and the Variety Club.

He and his son, Paul, owned the 620 Club restaurant in Minneapolis for several years.

Survivors include his widow, Jeanette; a daughter, Jacqueline Hayes, Miami Beach, Fla.; five sons, Paul, St. Louis Park, Robert, Minneapolis, Richard, San Francisco, Daniel, Gem Lake, Minn., and Michael, Anoka; a brother, Alex, Montreal, Canada; a sister, Manya Gorokhov, in Russia, and 11 grandchildren.
