Services for Oscar B. Strand, 85, 6610 Normandale Rd., Edina, who died Tuesday, will be at 2:30 p.m. today at Morris Nilsen Mortuary, with burial in Oak Hill Cemetery.

He was co-publisher and editor of the Richfield News from 1941 to 1951 and of the Bloomington News from 1950 to 1951.

The real-estate developer also was co-owner of the Mount Normandale ski area from 1953 to 1959.

Ramon Roubideaux, Rapid City lawyer, said it will take tremendous pressure to force the federal government to re-examine the treaties, and "It would be best to have a couple thousand Indians there."

Many treaty provisions, Roubideaux said, were unwritten.

"Indians never did give up in treaties unwritten rights involving hunting, fishing, minerals, water and others," Roubideaux said. "Those unmentioned rights were taken away because the federal government interpreted the
