

President of Investment
and Loan Company Dies

Services Will
Be Held Today

Funeral Will Be Conducted
at Residence by Dr.
Lucius H. Bugbee.

The funeral of Thomas A. Jamieson, 1807 Dupont avenue south, president of the Towle-Jamieson Investment Co. of Minneapolis, and active in the investment business in Minneapolis for more than 30 years, will take place from the residence at 2 p. m. today. The services will be conducted by Dr. Lucius H. Bugbee.

The burial will be at Lakewood cemetery.

Mr. Jamieson died Saturday at Northwestern hospital of pneumonia, following an operation. He was 53 years old. Mr. and Mrs. Jamieson had returned from Pasadena, Calif., where they spent the winter, about two weeks ago.

Besides his widow, Mrs. Jennie Fanning Jamieson, and a son, Carson, a student at Princeton university, there is a brother, David Jamieson, Duluth, and two sisters, Mrs. Martha Sanger, Lisbon, West Va., and Mrs. May Lynch, Omaha, Neb., surviving. Carson Jamieson had returned to Minneapolis and was with his father before he died.

Mr. Jamieson was born in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., July 19, 1867. His boyhood was spent in Canada and Duluth. On August 22, 1900, he married Jennie L. Fanning, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. T. Fanning, Minneapolis.

When George E. Howie and Mr. Jamieson organized the Towle-Jamieson Investment Co., Mr. Jamieson, who had been engaged in the investment business in the city, was made president. He also was vice president of the Jamieson-Towle-Willoughby corporation of San Francisco.

He was a member of the official board of the Hennepin Avenue Methodist church, a trustee of Hamline university, and a member of the Minneapolis Lafayette, Woodhill and Interlachen clubs and the Annandale club at Pasadena.
