

City Woman Dies of Crash Injuries

A young Minneapolis woman died in Hennepin County General Hospital Sunday of injuries suffered in a traffic accident Saturday night on E. Lake of the Isles Blvd.

Her death and those of four other persons brought the 1965 death toll on Minnesota highways to 480, compared with 524 a year ago.

Miss Holm was injured about 8 p.m. Saturday when a car in which she was riding missed a curve and smashed into a tree at 2631 E. Lake of the Isles Blvd.

SHE WAS the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Holm, De Smet, S.D. Her roommate, Karen Jones, 17, was listed in critical condition yesterday with injuries suffered in the same accident.

Leonard V. Williamette, 21, 16 W. 35th St., whom police identified as the driver of the car, and Phil Ritchie, 20, 2727 Portland Av., a passenger, were in serious condition with head injuries.

Mrs. Serada was killed Sunday night when a Rock Island Rocket passenger train slammed into a car she was driving at a crossing on Hwy. 30 near Ellendale.

Her husband, Edward, was injured in the crash and hospitalized at Albert Lea. His condition was not immediately known.

Yanish was killed early yesterday when his car hit the side of a Soo Line freight train on County Road 3 about 2 miles west of Annandale. The Wright County sheriff's office said the 94-car train carried the automobile about three-quarters of a mile.

The Heintz boy, son of Mr. and Mrs. Emil Heintz, was struck by a hit-and-run car about 8 p.m. Saturday as he walked along County Road 4 just outside the Rochester city limits.

THE OLMSTED County sheriff's office arrested a man believed to be the driver of the car.

The suspect, William J. Reiland, Douglas, Minn., was charged with driving after his license had been revoked and released on \$100 bail.

He told authorities he knew he had hit a child or an animal but had returned home. There he heard of the boy's death on a news broadcast, he said, which prompted him to return to the accident scene. He was arrested there.

Mrs. Westerberg died and her husband and two other persons were injured when their car left Hwy. 71 north of Sauk Centre Saturday

Westerberg was in satisfactory condition in a Sauk Centre hospital. Chester Gummiela, Sauk Centre, and Lois Pepin, Long Prairie, were in fair condition.
