

N. H. Cary, father of Dr. H. E. Cary, 1601 Park avenue, was bitten by his dog Tuesday while he attempted to administer some medicine to it, and as the dog later developed symptoms of the rabies, Mr. Cary was hurried to the Ann Arbor (Mich.) Pasteur institute by his son, who was afraid that serious complications might ensue. Mr. Cary lives at 2510 Portland avenue and is a great lover of dogs. When he noticed Tuesday that his pet canine seemed to be feeling unwell he tried to give it some dog medicine, but during these attempts the dog bit him slightly on the hand. The wound was hardly more than a scratch, but when Dr. Cary was consulted he advised the shooting of the dog and insisted that its brain be examined by the city bacteriologist. When the examination was made it was found that the brain of the animal was teeming with negri bodies in the ganglia cells, which proved conclusively that the dog had suffered from the rabies.
