

They Make Rich Hauls at H. F. Legg's Residence and Elsewhere.

The circus burglar got in his work on Saturday, in spite of the warnings of the police. At the home of Harry F. Legg, the jeweler, at 1601 Park av, goods valued at \$1,000 were taken. The family was away from home at the time and the house was deserted.

About \$200 worth of jewelry and silverware was taken from C. A. Mitchell, who is living in A. J. Blethen's house on 10th st. Nobody was at home. The burglar had made his way into the basement before the family left the house, and was locked in there. He had to kick the door down to get out. Then he ransacked the house at his leisure.

Some time yesterday, presumably early in the evening, the glove store of M. B. Woodruff, and the music store of W. L. Smith, 324 1st av S, were entered. The burglars got in by removing glass from the window of the glove store. Nothing of great value has been missed. A small haul was made at L. Lehman's pawn shop, 327 Washington av S.
