FIRE MAKES SECOND VISIT.—A second call to the fire department was sent in from 367 Jackson street early yesterday morning, as a result of which after the firemen had fought the flames for hours a second time, the building was damaged to the extent of \$10,000. Fire accompanied by an explosion of illuminating gas, Saturday night, damaged the building to an extent of about \$500. The flames in both instances were confined to the first floor, occupied by the McBride Electrical company, the Minnesota Chandelier company and the Edwards' cafe. The upper floors were damaged by smoke. Early Sunday morning the fire was declared out by the firemen and it was not until 4:30 o'clock this morning that the flames burst out again. Fire twice attacked the home of M. A. Robertson, 707 Fairmount avenue, damaging the house to the extent of about \$500. The house was left in charge of a servant in the absence of the family in California, and the fire in both instances is supposed to have been caused by defective furnace flues.
